Collection Information

<u>Abstract</u>: This collection contains photographs, certificates and school diplomas of Worcester, Massachusetts residents Henry Chin and his family.

Historical / Biographical Notes

Henry I. Sheu Chin and wife Ung Shee Chin were the first Chinese family to settle in Worcester, Massachusetts and founded the first Chinese laundry in he city. Mr. and Mrs. Chin owned a laundry, a restaurant and a grocery store which catered to the small Chinese population in the city. Mr. and Mrs. Chin had six children; Luther, Ettie, Stanley, Rockwood, Henry Jr. and Barbara. Son, Rockwood Chin graduated from North High School and then Yale University with three degrees; bachelor's with history honors in 1932, a master's in government in 1934 and a Ph.D. in international economics in 1937. Rockwood died on February 24, 1998. Sister Ettie Chin Hong lived in Freeport, NY. at the time of his death. Luther and Stanley both graduated from North High School and then later from Worcester Polytechnic Institute.

Brother Henry Chin Jr. was married to Lay Shee Chin and had five children; Wesley, Raymond, Eugene, Ruby and Irving. Irving also graduated from North High School in 1949 and from Yale University in 1953.

Henry I. Chin died in 1934 and wife Ung Shee Chin died in 1937. Henry was given permission by the immigration authorities to return to China and bring back his bride to Worcester. At that time he opened a store on Mechanic Street dealing in Chinese merchandise. Mr. And Mrs. Chin were also believed to be the first members of a Baptist Mission Sunday School program for Chinese people. In later years the family was affiliated with Wesley Methodist Church.

Scope and Content

This collection contains several photographs of the Chin Family taken between 1900 and 1910. There are also certificates and diplomas of the high schools and colleges that the Chin children attended.
