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#### **Collection Information**

<u>Abstract</u>: Collection contains two diaries written by Mrs Loring (Harriet) Coes from 1889 and 1895. Diaries are detailed talking about daily chores and activities surrounding her, her husband, their children and grand children.

The second series are correspondences (1911 - 1925) related to the Frank Loring and Cora Coes Family. Frank was the great grandson of Loring (1812 - 1912) and Harriet. They had two children Loring and Russell.

The third series are business records from Loring Coes and Company dated 1849 – 1901. They are associated with the accession number 1978.84.47, which was donated by Stephanie Klein in memory of Helen Rosoff Juster.

The fourth series are a number of patents related to the invention and improvement of wrenches (1859 - 1909)

#### Historical/Biographical Notes

Loring Coes was born at Webster Square (New Worcester) April 22, 1812. In 1836, with is brother Aury, they bought a company making machinery for the manufacture of woolens. This shop burned down and they moved to Springfield, MA where they developed a screw adjustable wrench now known as the Monkey Wrench. In 1841, they came back to Worcester where Loring applied for a received a patent for his invention and they formed the L. and A.G. Coes Company. In 1853, along with Levi Hardy, they bought the shop, machinery and business of Moses Clement whose shop was at the corner of Main and Mill Street. The partnership lasted until 1864 when the Coes Brothers bought Hardy out. In 1865, along with Mr. Hardy, they bought 100 acres of the Lyon Farm, where Coes Pond is today and put up a damn and shop to manufacture knives. In 1867, they built the lower damn at Coes Square. In 1869, the two brothers dissolved their partnership and divided the businesses. Loring kept the knife business and in 1871, built a four story factory at Coes Square to make wrenches.

Aury kept the wrench shop at Main and Mill Street and died in 1875. In 1902, Loring consolidated the knife and wrench business into the Coes Wrench Company. Loring was the consummate inventor and the Coes family was a constant and welcomed presence in the Webster Square area. He was marries to Harriet Coes and they had two children Chester and Jennie. Jennie had a son Frank who is mention in Mrs. Coes's diary. Loring died July 13, 1906.
