Historical/Biographical Notes

Solomon Dwinnell, a farmer, was born in Sutton in 1757. He married Mrs. Hannah Singletary Gould, daughter of Hon. Amos Singletary, member of congress from Massachusetts, and widow of Capt. Jonathan Gould. Dwinnell served with the Continental Army for the duration of the war, and saw action at Boston, Long Island, Bennington, Yorktown, and other locations. Dwinnell was father of six children. He died in Millbury in 1830.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of a typescript of Solomon Dwinnell's Revolutionary War diary, covering the period from August to November 1777, with photocopy of a page from the original, and related documents.
