Collection Information

Abstract: Major A.H. Johnson was a New Bedford native who enlisted in the 54th Reg't., Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry, and served as musician during the Civil War. As drummer boy, he was one of the youngest enlistees in the military. The collection includes documents relating to his native American ancestry, as well as military-related documents.

Biographical Information

Alexander H. Johnson was born in New Bedford, Massachusetts about 1847, said to be the son of a Narragansett Indian father and mother, and descendant of King Philip. He was raised by a black family in New Bedford. His adoptive father was William Henry Johnson, a prominent attorney in New Bedford.

Johnson enlisted at age 14 in the United States Navy as drummer boy prior to the outbreak of hostilities in the Civil War, and served aboard the frigate Sabine for about eight months. He then enlisted in the 54th Regiment, Massachusetts Volunteers in March, 1862, and served as musician throughout the hostilities. He was mustered out August 20, 1865.

Johnson lived in Worcester for the rest of his life, and was active as a musician and promoter of drumming. He was a member and active in the affairs of Col. George H. Ward Post, No. 10, G.A.R. in Worcester, in which he held the rank of Major.

Johnson died in 1930 at the age of 83.

Scope and Content

The collection includes information concerning the ancestry of Alexander H. Johnson, including census forms, resident lists, ship's rosters, lists of Native Americans resident in the area, and other similar information, ranging from the 1770s to the mid 19th century. Also included are numerous records of Johnson's military career, including his discharge, applications for veterans pension, application for disability pension, and related documents, ranging from the 1880s to the 1920s. Miscellaneous items include cards hand written by Mr. Johnson illustrating his handwriting, and materials on the frigate Sabine, on which he served early in the 1860s, and the schooner Dobbin.

Items are photocopies of the originals, acquired by Johnson's descendants from various federal sources. The collection has been arranged topically.

Series Description

Series 1. Family History/Genealogy. This series includes letters relative to Johnson's ancestry, excerpts from official records, lists of Native Americans, and various documents which illustrate the family ancestry.

Series 2. Military Papers. Records include discharge papers, numerous affidavits in regard to pension and disability applications and burial claims, and other documents relating to Johnson's service with the 54th Reg't., Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry.

Series 3. Miscellaneous. Includes copies of cards handwritten by Johnson, and information from the United States Coast Guard relative to the schooner Dobbin and the frigate Sabine, on which Johnson served in the early 1860s.
