Collection Information

<u>Abstract</u>: The collection contains three volumes, once each from Daniel Kinsley, Carrie Carelton Kinsley (his daughter) and Florence Josephine Kinsley (his daughter). Daniel Kinsley's Memo Book is divided in four sections; the first section lists work performed by him and his salary, 1847-1903; the second section is a record of his receipts and expenditures, 1848 – 1921; the third section records important events of his life, 1857 – 1921; the final section records the value of his assets, 1856 - 1886.

The second volume is an autograph book kept by Carrie Crelton Kinsley for the years 1877 0 1887. Many of the autographs are from students at the Worcester High School. The final volume is an undated recipe book of Florence Josephine Kinsley.

Historical/Biographical Notes

Daniel Kingsley (1829 – 1923), a son of Ben Alvah Kinsley was born in Fletcher, Vermont. He moved to North Brookfield, Massachusetts and worked as a farmer for Barnum Nye. In 1853, he was chosen messenger for the courts at Worcester, a position he held for the next fifty years. Kinsely was active in the formation of the Y.M.C.A. in Worcester and was a member of the Plymouth Congregational Church. In 1853, he planted a tree on the court house grounds which survived over a hundred years and became known as the Kinsley Elm. Kinsley married Harriet Newell Mudgett (- 1900) in 1854 and the couple had six children.

Scope and Content
