Historical/Biographical Notes

Howard E, Reed moved to Woodland St., Worcester, MA at the age of seven. He graduated from Worcester Polytechnic Institute and went to work in his father's company Reed & Prince Manufacturing. He started off as an engineer, the moved his way up to superintendant and vice president. In 1916, Reed owned a company called the Reed Small Tool Works, and owned the Rolled Thread Company in 1923. In World War I, he was lieutenant commander in the U.S. Navy and, after leaving, manufactured tools and machine designs for the navy. In 1944, he moved to Maine.
