<u>Abstract</u>: H. Arthur Smith was a Worcester native, served in the United States Army during World War II, later salesman, assistant treasurer, and production assistant at Smith and Fyfe Dairimaid Ice Cream Co. in Worcester. He died September 5, 1997, at the age of 77.

Historical/Biographical Notes

H. Arthur Smith was born in Worcester about 1920, and attended Worcester Academy. He was an army veteran of World war II, serving in the Aleutians. Following the war, he was employed as a salesman at Smith & Fyfe, Dairimaid Ice Cream Company on Grove Street in Worcester. He later was assistant to the Treasurer, and production assistant. He was an active member of the First Baptist Church in Worcester, a 50 year member of Montacute Lodge of Masons, a member of Worcester Economic Club, Hudson Hoagland Society of the Worcester Foundation for Biomedical Research, past president of Young Men's Republican Club of Worcester, and life member of Disabled American veterans. He also oversaw the youth baseball team sponsored by Smith & Fyfe Dairimaid Ice Cream during the late 1950s. Smith died September 5, 1997, at the age of 77.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of photographs taken in 1957 and 1959 of the youth baseball team sponsored by Dairimaid Ice Cream (Smith & Fyfe), assorted business cards and pass to concelebrated mass (ca. 1940s), political advertisement, clipping, and button re reelection of William A. Bennett as mayor of Worcester (ca. 1940s). Also includes group photographs of company outings and political gatherings, inscribed autograph book, and additional ephemera.

Series Description

The collection is divided into two series, arranged by form and format:

Series 1: Photographs. Baseball teams, political groups, trucks, etc.

Series 2: Ephemera. Political and identification buttons, programs, etc.
