Historical/Biographical Notes

Rev. Abijah Perkins Marvin was born February 1, 1813 in Lyme, Connecticut to Asahei and Azubah (Sill) Marvin. He earned degrees from Washington (now Trinity) in 1839 and graduated

for Yale Theological Seminary in 1842 and became Pastor of the Congregational Church in Winchendon, Mass in 1843. On March 5, 1845 he married a Caroline Holbrook of Holden, Mass. And they have three children; Caroline Emily (1846), Mary Azubah (1849) and Katharine Mather (1861). He disappears from the records for several years until re-appearing in the Worcester City Directories in 1870 and 1871 and living at the corner of Oread and Beacon Street. Soon after, he moves to Lancaster, MA where he dies on October 19, 1889 at the age of 76.
