Collection Information

Abstract : The collection contains four account books that belonged to Benjamin W. Childs (- 1910). The account books date from 1858 – 1906. The earliest ones deal with his early business in Oxford, MA. He moved to Worcester in 1870.

Historical/Biographical Notes

Benjamin W. Childs was born in 1839 in Massachusetts. The 1870 census indicates that he lived

in Oxford, Massachusetts with his wife Olive and children Thomas (3) and Fannie (2). His occupation was listed as a boot and shoe dealer. By 1871, Benjamin had moved to Worcester, Massachusetts and opened B.W. Childs and Manning Brothers Boot and Shoe Manufacturing at 18 Pleasant Street. In 1874 the name had changed to B.W. Childs and Irving W. Tourtellote Boot and Shoe Manufacturing at 17 Mechanic Street. By 1877, the name changed again to Childs, Smith and Co. at 17 Mechanic. The company remained in business until Benjamin's death on May 21, 1910 at the age of 71.

Scope and Content
