Historical/Biographical Notes

Student's research papers were written during the 1970s-1980s by students in several sociology courses and related fields, taught by several professors at Clark University, Worcester. The files were transferred to Worcester Historical Museum in 1991 as a reference resource.

Scope and Content

The collection includes approximately 375 student papers written on all aspects of Worcester sociology in the 1970s and 1980s. Although some of the material is dated, the papers are an excellent resource, which provide significant insight not only into the sociology of Worcester, but also into the history and activities of many of the minority populations in the city.
