Collection Information

Abstract: The collection consists of a single document, a photograph of the English High School Class of 1913, taken on the steps of the building later known as Classical High School.

Historical Information

The photograph of the Class of 1913 of English High School is taken on the front steps of the building later known as Classical High School in Worcester. English High School was one of the early high schools in the city, and occupied a site at Chatham and Irving Streets. Classical High School also existed at the same time and occupied the school building shown in the photograph toward the end of the 19th century. Early in the 20th century, Classical High School relocated to a new facility, and changed its name to Commerce High School. English High School then occupied the Classical High School building, and ultimately changed its name from English High School to Classical High School.

The photograph is a silver gelatin print, a process extensively used from the late 1800s to the present. It shows mirroring, a common form of deterioration in early photographs of this process, caused by alteration of the silver salts from light exposure and improper storage.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of a single group photograph of the Class of 1913 of English High School in Worcester, which is a source for both family history and Worcester school history. In addition the photograph documents clothing and hair styles of 1913, contributing to the understanding of styles as dating techniques. The photograph also provides insight into changing photographic processes and styles.
