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### Collection Information

Abstract: Alfred Seelye Roe was a Civil War veteran, educator, state senator and active member of the Worcester community. Following the war he pursued a teaching career and then serving as principal of Worcester High School. The Roe Collection illustrates events taking part in both his professional and personal life.

Finding Aids: Finding Aid in print form available at Worcester Historical Museum Library and Archives.

Provenance: Some of the items in this collection were possibly donated by the American Antiquarian Society. There are several items in this collection that have old accession numbers. The provenance for much of the collection is unknown.

Fonds: Alfred S. Roe has collections in the archives of Wesleyan University, New York Public Library, American Antiquarian Society and Massachusetts Historical Society. Worcester Historical Museum has a sewing kit owned by Alfred S. Roe in their collection (1969.14.1).

Roe, Alfred S. (Alfred Seelye), 1844-1917

### Biographical Information

Alfred Seelye Roe was born in Wayne County, New York on June 8, 1844. He is the son of Austin M. Roe and Polly Catherine Seelye.

Roe served during the Civil War with Company A, Ninth New York Heavy Artillery from January 1864 to June 1865. Roe was captured in the Battle of Monocacy in Maryland on July 9, 1864, and was imprisoned at Danville, Virginia, for almost eight months.

After the Civil War, Roe attended Wesleyan University and graduated in 1870. He taught in New York state then Rutland, Massachusetts. He was a teacher then principal of Worcester High School in 1878-1890.

Roe was in the Massachusetts state legislature for three terms from 1892-1895 and state senator for the second Worcester district from 1896-1898.

Roe was an active member of Young Men's Christian Association, American Red Cross, Society of Antiquity (now Worcester Historical Museum), Grand Army of the Republic and was a well-respected member of the Worcester community. He was a historian with a focus on the Civil War and Roe family genealogy.

Roe married Nora Ardelia Metcalf (April, 1856 - Feb, 1910) on June 22, 1874. He was father of two daughters Annabel C. Roe (September 3, 1879 - April 20, 1966) and Harriet E. Roe (June 5, 1885 - March 20, 1975). Both daughters were also teachers. Alfred Seelye Roe died on January 6, 1917.

### Scope and Content

The Alfred S. Roe Collection contains a large amount of genealogical information for the Roe-Brown family that was researched by and for Alfred S. Roe. This series includes handwritten notes, newspaper clippings, and a notebook.

The collection contains correspondences to Alfred S. Roe that are both personal and professional in nature. A series is dedicated to correspondence pertaining to the recently established Worcester Auxiliary of the American Red Cross. Some of the letters in this subseries are addressed to Arthur Reed Taft, the president of the branch in 1898. Roe was secretary at the time. Personal correspondence includes birth announcements, wedding invitations and letters from George Mortimer Roe, his brother. Another subseries is correspondence addressed to his daughters Annabel C. Roe and Harriet E. Roe and his father Austin Roe.

Six scrapbooks are also in the collection. Five scrapbooks contain entries written by Roe from 1878-1890 about the daily activity at Worcester High School as well as invitations, tickets, newspaper clippings, whole issues of school newspapers, commencement programs and classroom rosters and other miscellany. One scrapbook is dedicated to the Worcester High School Association, an alumni organization, containing handwritten entries from June 1, 1886 - July 1, 1921.

There are eight black and white photographs in the collection, presumably of family. Dates and people are unknown.

The miscellaneous series includes treasurer's receipt from American National Red Cross Relief Committee in 1890s, address book containing information about Worcester in the mid to late 1800s, brochures, envelopes and newspaper clippings.
