Abstract : The collection contains a published autobiography, audio CD, copies of newspaper articles and magazine pages, sheet music booklets, and song books. All of these materials are evidence of the work between 1910 and 1960 of eleven composers and musicians.

### **Historical/Biographical Notes**

Jazz and pop music made a huge outbreak during the 1930's and 1940's with iconic singers like Frank Sinatra, Louis Armstrong, and Ella Fitzgerald making famous the songs of composers and songwriters of the time. Eleven of these composers and musicians who created the famous songs of the age could trace their history through Worcester, Massachusetts.

Edward Boyle, Cole Porter, John Redmond, and Einar Swan were songwriters and composers who once lived, worked, and studied in Worcester before going on to write some of the most famous hit songs of the age. Joe Goodwin, Irene Higginbotham, Jack Robbins, Henry Sullivan, and the three Tobias brothers, Henry, Harry, and Charlie, all were born and raised in Worcester, adding to the area's legacy through their work in the music industry.

### **Scope and Content**

This collection includes copies of newspaper and magazine articles regarding the lives and professional work of eleven composers and musicians: Edward Boyle, Carroll Gibbons, Joe Goodwin, Irene Higginbotham, Cole Porter, John Redmond, Henry Sullivan, Einar Swan, Henry Tobias, Harry Tobias, and Charlie Tobias. Also in this collection are sheet music booklets for many of these artists' songs as well as song books with the lyrics of these artists' best known songs.

## **Series Descriptions**

### **Series 1: Miscellaneous**

Series description: This series includes two objects: a published book by musician Henry Tobias and an audio CD which includes songs by composer Carroll Gibbons, both of whom are found throughout the collection.

### **Series 2: Composers and Musicians**

Series description: This series contains copies of song lyrics by each composer and musician, many of the originals of which can be found in Series 3. Sheet Music booklets are also included in this collection and are arranged by composer or musician of songs of the 1940's, 1950's and 1960's.

### **Series 3: Song Books**

Series description: This series includes song books which contain the lyrics of songs by the composer and musicians named in this collection during the 1940's, 1950's and 1960's.
