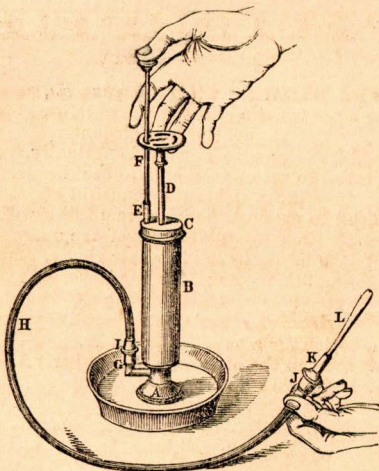

It is ready for use at any moment, without the trouble of adjusting a single screw, and is not liable to get out of order. It enables the individual to inject any desirable quantity of fluid without interruption, and is preeminently superior as a "SELF SYRINGE," inasmuch as the piston may be worked with one hand, thereby leaving the other hand free to direct the terminal tube. This tube, K, L, as seen below, may be used for injecting the bowels of an infant or an adult, or for any of the purposes of a "Female Syringe."

VIEW AND DESCRIPTION OF THE INSTRUMENT.



A, Base, connected by a screw, and resting in a basin or vessel. It contains a cavity and valve, through which the fluid in the vessel is drawn into the barrel. B, Barrel. C, Cap. D, Piston. F, Piston standard, inserted into the socket E. G, Elbow. H, Flexible Tube. I, Short metallic coupling. J, Terminal metallic coupling, containing a cavity and valve. K, L, Terminal or injecting tube, connected with J by a screw.

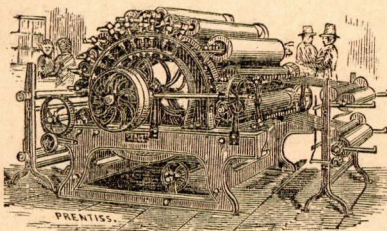

EDUCATION.

The Schools in Worcester have long been noted for their excellence, and the facilities for education here are ample for all classes. Our

PUBLIC SCHOOLS,

thirty-three in number, commencing with the Primary, where children four years of age may commence with the alphabet, and closing with the Classical and English High School, in which instruction is given by accomplished teachers in all the higher English branches, as well as the Latin, Greek and French languages, to all who wish, and are able to pass the high standard of examination prescribed by the School Committee. These schools are in session from 40 to 44 weeks in each year, in three terms, commencing on the second Monday in January and May, and the first in September. Besides these, there have for many years been established the YOUNG MEN'S WINTER SCHOOL, for apprentices and others who labor during the Summer; and FREE EVENING SCHOOLS, for the instruction of adults and others of both sexes in all the branches of an English education.

If through the exceeding strictness of the rules adopted by the School Committee, or the inconvenience caused by the location of the schools nearly all on one side of the centre and a majority of the children on the other, any are deprived of instruction in the public schools, numerous

PRIVATE SCHOOLS

of every grade are open for their reception, at prices corresponding with the branches of learning taught in them. Among the more prominent of these are Mr. Bent's "SALISBURY MANSION SCHOOL," Lincoln Square; Miss Bigelow's "BOARDING AND DAY SCHOOL," in Union Block; Mr. Thayer's "OREAD INSTITUTE," on a romantic eminence west from the City Hall; the WORCESTER ACADEMY, in charge of Mr. Avery, and Mr. Eaton's COMMERCIAL INSTITUTE, in the Bank Block—all of which are boarding schools of high grade, and receive many scholars from abroad.

The Catholics, besides contributing largely in scholars to the public schools, sustain a private school under Mr. Fitzgerald, on Temple street, and send some of their children to the

COLLEGE OF THE HOLY CROSS,

on Mount St. James. The principal edifice of this institution was destroyed by fire in 1852, but is in process of rebuilding on an enlarged scale. Rev. Ignatius T. Ciampi is President; Rev. P. Blenkinsop, Vice President; and Rev. K. A. Kennedy, Professor of Natural Philosophy. For professional education, we have the

WORCESTER MEDICAL INSTITUTION,

whose showy edifice, on Union Hill, is seen from all quarters. Here thorough medical instruction is given by a full board of Professors, on the Eclectic plan,—commencing in March annually. Hon. Sullivan Fay, President; Wm. Bush, Esq. Secretary.

Among our educational facilities, we must not omit to mention

THE WORCESTER LYCEUM,
