



be designated thereon, and at such prices as the City Council may direct, to any inhabitant of said city—not exceeding two lots to any individual,—which lots may be transferred by deed to any other individual of said City, not the owner of any lots in said Cemetery, which shall be valid only when recorded in a book kept for the purpose by the said City Treasurer, whose duty it shall be to provide and keep such book, and enter therein a record of all conveyances by him made, as well as of such transfers. Said entry shall show the date of the conveyance, and of the entry; the names of the grantor, and the grantee; the avenue, drive way, walk, or path, on which it is located; the number of the lot; and the name of one or more abutting owners.

SEC. 4. The City Treasurer shall receive all moneys paid for said lots, when he shall deliver the deeds; and shall account therefor, as for other receipts for said city; and shall enter the name of each purchaser in a book kept by each of the city funeral undertakers, whenever either of them shall request it; and all such receipts shall be devoted to the liquidation of the cost of said Cemetery, and

to the improvement of the same.

SEC. 5. The City Funeral Undertakers may make burials in such parts of said cemetery as shall be specially set apart for families, in lots of eight by sixteen feet each, for which no charge shall be made, and no title given; and they shall be taken up successively, without leaving vacant intervening lots, except by the written order of the Committee or agent in charge;—and, whenever a new lot is taken, the undertaker conducting the burial, shall make an entry thereof in the book in his possession, and also a return to the City Treasurer, forthwith, who shall make a like entry in his book, and also in that kept by any other undertaker, at the request of the latter; and no undertaker shall make burials on any unoccupied lot, without making such entry and return.

SEC. 6. The city funeral undertakers may also make burials upon any portion of said cemetery which has been specially set apart for the interment of the remains of non-residents, upon lots of sufficient capacity for a single grave, to be taken and an entry and return to be made in the same manner as is provided in Section fifth; and also the name, age, and residence of such persons, so far as the

facts can be ascertained.

SEC. 7. All conveyances made under this Ordinance, shall subject the premises granted to all such Rules, By-Laws, Orders, and Ordinances, as the City Council of the City of Worcester shall from time to time make, for the governing and managing of said Cemetery.

Passed Oct. 11, 1852.

These are two in number, and are supplied with teachers qualified to give thorough instruction in all the branches required by the State laws to be taught in schools of this grade, including with the previous studies, grammar, composition, history, &c. For admission to any of the above schools, application must be made to the Secretary of the School Committee. The next and highest grade of our free schools is the

# CLASSICAL AND ENGLISH HIGH SCHOOL.

which, as well as the Grammar schools, is open for the reception of pupils from all parts of the city. Instruction is here given in all the higher English branches of learning, besides the French, Latin and Greek languages, drawing, &c. This school is considered fully equal to the best Academies in the country; and its advantages are appreciated by many of our citizens. Scholars are examined for admission to the High School on the first day of each term. The above schools are located in the central part of the city. At different points around the centre are fourteen

## MIXED SUBURBAN SCHOOLS.

answaring, generally, to common district schools, but most of them improved by the employment of permanent female teachers.

# CEMETERIES.

The new HOPE CEMETERY, purchased in 1851, by the City Fathers, has been laid out in part, and dedicated by appropriate services for use as a "city of the dead." 


